

Sean R. Elsbernd

Chief of Staff for San Francisco Mayor London Breed

Born February 7, 1976, Sean Elsbernd represented <u>District 7</u>, encompassing the single-family neighborhoods West of Twin Peaks, as well as the largest rental housing neighborhood west of the Mississippi – the Villas at Parkmerced. Lake Merced, Harding Park Golf Course, San Francisco State University, City College of San Francisco, and Laguna Honda Hospital and Rehabilitation Center are some of the notable landmarks in District 7.

The people of District 7 elected Sean to the Board of Supervisors in November 2004, following his August 2004 appointment to the Board by Mayor Gavin Newsom. He currently serves as Vice-Chair of the Rules Committee and Chair of the Transportation Authority's Finance Committee. Additionally, he sits on the Health Service System Board and the Retirement Board serving City employees and City retirees. Sean has served on the Budget and Finance Committee of the Board of Supervisors in each of his two complete years as a member of the Board.

Before being appointed supervisor, Sean served as Mayor Newsom's liaison to the Board of Supervisors. Prior to joining the Newsom administration in January 2004, Sean worked as then-Supervisor Tony Hall's chief legislative aide for three years. Prior to his work in City Hall, Sean worked with the San Francisco District Attorney's Office and in the office of Congressman Tom Lantos as a co-director of the Congressional Human Rights Caucus. Supervisor. Sean is a fourth-generation San Franciscan -- born, raised, and educated in District 7. He attended grammar school at St. Cecilia's and then joined Saint Ignatius College Preparatory's first coeducational class, graduating in 1993. He went on to receive his BA from Claremont McKenna College in 1997 and graduated from University of California Hastings College of the Law in 2000. He was subsequently admitted to the California Bar in December 2000.

During Sean's tenure on the Board of Supervisors, he has focused his efforts on: (1) streamlining and restraining City expenditures, and ensuring fiscal accountability for each tax dollar appropriated; (2) securing funding for street re-paving, and park and library renovations; (3) requiring effective and long range planning for all City and County capital projects; (4) balancing the need to protect health and retirement benefits for City employees and City retirees with the need to protect the City's overall financial structure; and, (5) basic quality of life issues of concern to his constituents in District 7.

Sean served as the State Director for US Senator Diane Feinstein until San Francisco Mayor, London Breed, appointed Elsbernd as her Chief of Staff. He began his new role in the San Francisco's mayor's office in November 2018.
